**Description:**

Compaq released its iPAQ Pocket PC in Apr-2000. It is a personal digital assistant (PDA) and a PC that runs the Windows operating system (it can also run Linux).

The iPAQ uses a 32-bit ARM CPU, with ROM and SDRAM depending on the model. It is not yet known which model this item is, although it is clearly an early one.

The front panel was protected by a shield which 'peeled' sideways. The panel had four buttons beside a five-way joystick below a touch-sensitive screen, plus power and backlight buttons above the screen, a side recording button, and a reset button at the bottom beside a combined external USB and RS323C communications port. At the top there was a 115kbps infrared port, with a stylus and 3.5mm stereo output port beside it. Applications could customise the buttons below the screen.
