This wooden framed poster, about 8"x8", is from an exhibition *Computation in the era of Queen Elizabeth I (1533-1603)*, part of a larger exhibition created by Prof.J.G.Byrne that was entitled *Computing through the Ages* and held in the Long Room of the Old Library in Trinity College Dublin from September, 1986, which amongst other exhibits also included an exhibition on *Charles Babbage's Computing Engines*, see elsewhere in this catalog. This large exhibition was timed to coincide with a conference of the International Federation of Information Processing (IFIP) held in Trinity College Dublin in September, 1986.

These exhibition materials were re-used as part of the *Treasures of the Mind* exhibition held in the Colonnades Gallery of the Old Library for the TCD Quatercentenary in 1992.
