Description:

In May-2016 Prof.Barbara Wright found a 1-page list of what was covered in a set of recorded interviews "Track 1-9" (see Fig.1) of Prof.J.G.Byrne (sometimes called the father of computer science in Ireland, who sadly had passed away shortly beforehand), but neither she nor others had these or knew who recorded them and why. Despite a fairly intensive search no-one was found who knew anything about these interviews.

An appeal was launched both by email and via this catalog to try to find the set of recordings, or at least to try to find someone who might know who recorded the interviews, as they would be of great value to the School of Computer Science and Statistics, TCD, where an effort was underway to compose a book about Prof.Byrne, and the interviews would be extremely helpful.

On 18-Sep-2016 these mysterious recordings were found, thanks to Prof.Byrne's nephew Edmund Williams, Rosemary Welsh and Chris Horn. The recordings are in Maurice & Jane O'Keefe's collection *Irish Life and Lore*, see [1] and [2]. They are available on a CD and/or electronic file, and copies of both have been deposited in this collection and in the associated folder in this collection.

The full set of the *Irish Life and Lore* interview series is also in the TCD Library [3], including the *Trinity College Dublin Collection* [4] of interviews of TCD staff, also see list in Fig.3. Some other *Irish Life and Lore* collections also include TCD staff, e.g. Roderick Kernan in the *South Dublin Collection* [5], Mary Boydell in the *Fleischmann Collection* [6], Valentine Rice in the *Kerry Collections* [7], and Roy Johnston in the *RDS Collection* [8].

John Byrne b. 1933

Track 1: Background, growing up in Dublin (Rathfarnham), his early education and later entry to Trinity College Dublin in 1952 as an undergraduate, studying French and Classics, prior to beginning his engineering studies. Pays special tribute to his mentor Victor Graham in this regard. Being a Roman Catholic, a dispensation from the Church was required in order for him to take up his place at Trinity.

Track 2: Graduating in Civil Engineering, working in Birmingham for an engineering firm at that time constructing the Hogan Stand for Croke Park.

On returning to Dublin, employment with Dublin Corporation for three months, before enrolling for a Diploma in Concrete Technology at Imperial College, London.

Track 3: 1957 – Enrolled for a Ph.D. in Trinity College – in summer of 1958, spent three months with English Electric in Stafford, using the DEUCE (Digital Electronic Universal Computing Engine) computer.

Track 4: Having graduated with a Ph.D., was awarded an ICI Fellowship and was appointed lecturer in Trinity College. His memories of that time, particularly the IBM 1620 computer acquired by the Engineering School. The educational programmes on offer to students in his Department.

Track 5: In 1968, the focus on the need to upgrade the computing system and an anecdote about the location of the computer – the IBM 360/44 mainframe – the size of which dictated its installation in a hut beside the Berkeley library.

Track 6: Summary of his professional career to 1973, when he was elected to a Chair of Computer Science at Trinity College.

Track 7: The 1980s and the relocation of his department to Pearse St and subsequently to the O'Reilly Institute.

Track 8: Discusses the decision to confer academic awards on Dublin Institute of Technology students through Trinity College.

Track 9: The highs and lows of his professional life, and the digitization of the printed TCD Library catalogue (1872), of over 5,000 pages.
