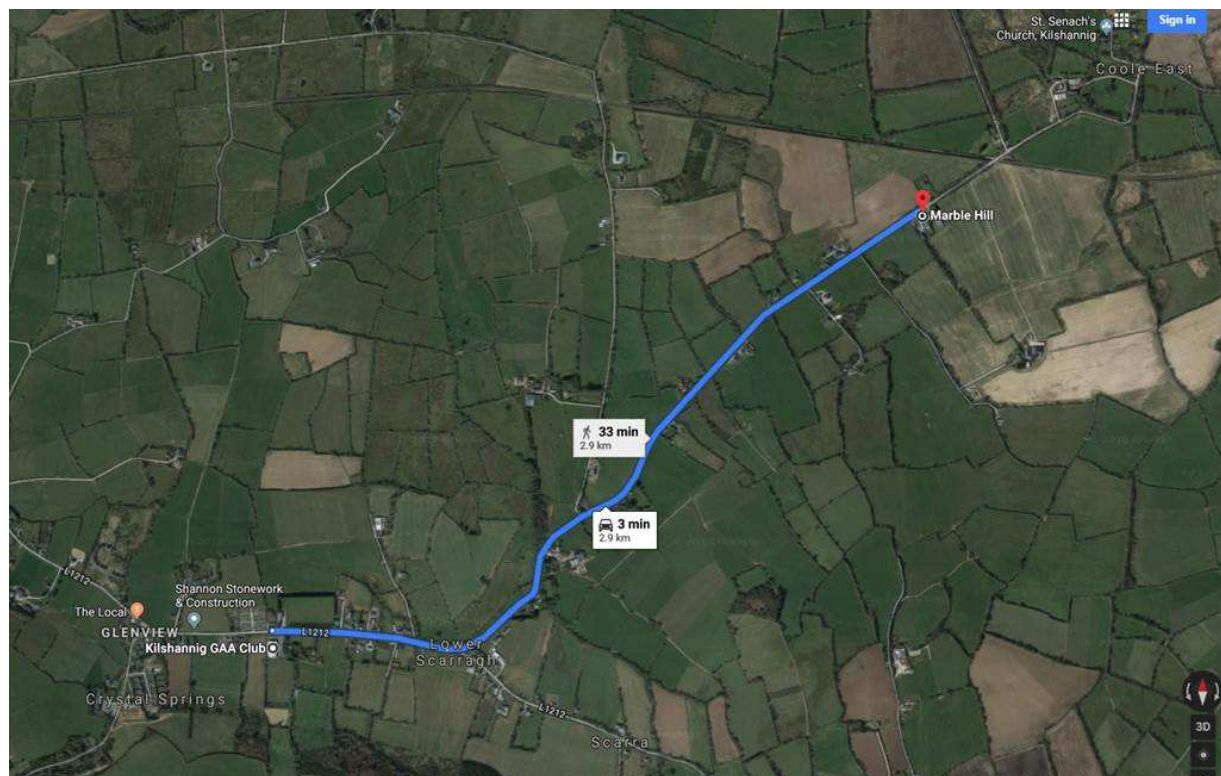

On the 1911 Census he is transcribed as John David but it looks like John Davis. On Paddy's tree it is David.

Then this morning I went to Dronaile, which I'm fairly sure is where Bedelia Bridget Buckley (wife of Thomas Edward Ludgate, Percy's elder brother) was from, and that her father and brother were both named Maurice Buckley

When I looked at this last year I think I said there was no evidence of a surviving second child after Eileen in 1892 and after 1911 the chances would be next to zero. I also remember that Brian R thought they moved to the Hastings area and I gave you two possible deaths.
